

# FAIR RULES (cont.)



- Premium checks will be mailed to the address on file with exhibitor number within 14 six weeks from close of fair.
- Exhibitors may enter one entry per class. In the event of false entry, the 15 exhibit will be disqualified.
- 16 The Fair reserves the right to alter the order of showing a class and to cancel in the case of bad weather.
- 17 Decisions of the judges are final.
- 18 Exhibits will not be open to the public until entries have been judged. No one is permitted in the exhibition building during judging.
- 19 Any member of the fair board shall have the authority without liability or recourse to the Grant County Fair to bar an exhibitor, participant or their representative in the event of a discourteous act to a judge or official of the Fair and shall have the power to disqualify the exhibitor/participant who would have to forfeit all entry fees and any prize money that may have been awarded them.
- The Fair Board reserves the right to use any or all photos taken during the 20 fair events for publication.






